



## Instructions for Using Plug-Ins

Download the Plug-In and save it to **C: > Program Files > MyWrapperPlatinum > Plugins.**

Start MyWrapper Platinum. When you click on **Start A New Wrapper** you will see the Plug-In listed in the Wrapper Types dropdown list. Use it as you would any other item in the list.

### For the Candy Kisses

1. Download the circle.bmp file and save it in MyDocuments in a folder for MyWrapper Platinum where you will easily find it.
2. To make a Candy Kiss label, start MyWrapperPlatinum.
3. Click on Start A New Wrapper.
4. Select **Kiss** from the Wrapper Type dropdown menu.
5. Instead of selecting a standard background, click on the Open button and select the circle.bmp file you saved. When it opens you will see the circle inside the square. Make sure all your text fits inside the circle. If you are using a background then select it at this stage.

You will quickly see how your text looks on the background. You can move the text as necessary keeping in mind the approximate edge of the label as defined by the circle you had previously opened.

You can go back and forth between the circle and the background to make sure everything is just right. When finished, print the sheet as you normally do. The labels can be punched out using a 3/4" hole punch available from craft stores. Then you can use double sided tape or apply a glue stick to either the label or the bottom of the kiss.

### For the Paint Can Lids

1. Download the circle.bmp file and save it in MyDocuments in a folder for MyWrapper Platinum where you will easily find it.
2. To make a Paint Can Lid label, start MyWrapperPlatinum.
3. Click on Start A New Wrapper.
4. Select the Paint Can Lid you want from the Wrapper Type dropdown menu.
5. Instead of selecting a standard background, click on the Open button and select the circle.bmp file you saved. When it opens you will see the circle inside the square. Make sure all your text fits inside the circle. If you are using a background then select it at this stage.

You will quickly see how your text looks on the background. You can move the text as necessary keeping in mind the approximate edge of the label as defined by the circle you had previously opened.

You can go back and forth between the circle and the background to make sure everything is just right. When finished, print the sheet as you normally do and cut the labels from the sheet. We are working on having the outer circle print so you can follow it for cutting purposes.
